

Masculine and Feminine

Key Information

Nouns are words that name things, people, places and ideas. In French, **all** nouns are either **masculine** or **feminine**.

Words starting with a vowel have **'l'** in front of them instead of **le** or **la**.



masculine

Masculine nouns have **le** (the) or **un** (a/an) in front of them.

feminine

Feminine nouns have **la** (the) or **une** (a/an) in front of them.

remember

When you learn a new French word, you also need to learn if it's **masculine (m)** or **feminine (f)**.



Write the correct determiner for each noun depending on whether it's **masculine** or **feminine**. The first one has been done for you.



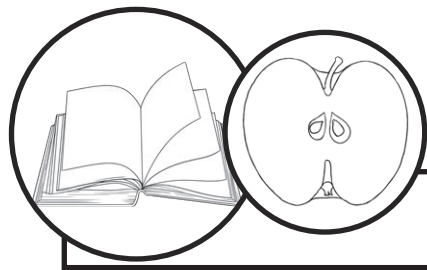

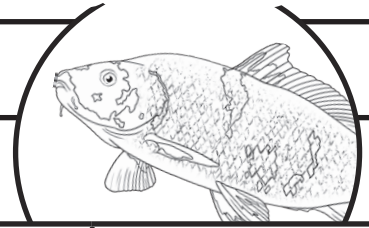
