- Pen with black (Waterproof) ink (Sakura Pigma Micron is an easy-to-use and readily available recommendation)
- Large container of water;
- Large flat or “mop” watercolour brush and smaller watercolour brushes
- Watercolour paints (either pan or tube) – Various colours
